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Acupuncture Certification for Medical Professionals (ACMP)

(A Medical Acupuncture Certificate Program at CITCM / CBC-CDUTCM)

1. Overview

The ACMP is a specialized training program designed to provide medical professionals and practitioners such as physicians, naturopathic doctors, chiropractors, dentists, physiotherapists, or any other regulated health practitioners with the knowledge and skills to integrate conventional and complementary treatment modalities, especially acupuncture, into their clinical practice.

Acupuncture is one of natural and holistic approaches in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) that involves inserting thin needles into specific points (acupoints) on the body to stimulate theflow of energy and promote natural healing. It has been used effectively as a therapy for various disorders in China for thousands of years. In recent years, acupuncture has also gained popularity as a complementary treatment option for a variety of health conditions around the world. The World Health Organization has identified that acupuncture is effective for a wide range of clinical conditions.

The ACMP is organized and delivered by the Canadian Institute of Traditional Chinese Medicine (<u>CITCM</u>) / Canadian Branch College of Chengdu University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (<u>CBC-CDUTCM</u>).

The CITCM, is an approved vocational training in Calgary, Alberta since 2004 through the Ministry of Education Private Career College and our acupuncture program is also approved by the College of Acupuncturists of Alberta (CAA).

By delivering comprehensive curriculum and over 1380 hours of clinic training, CITCM aims to train highly skilled Doctors of acupuncture, TCM practitioners, and massage therapists to treat patients' illness and maintain their health through natural medicine, and to educate society to understand and view the body, mind, and spirit as holism. By promoting the integration of TCMwith Western Medicine, CITCM provides innumerable opportunities for students to practice on a variety of clinical conditions, and to build their clinic confidence and experience furthermore through learning abroad in a hospital setting under successful professors and senior doctors.

As the Canadian Branch College of Chengdu University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (CBC-CDUTCM), CITCM collaborates with Chengdu University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (CDUTCM) in offering bachelor's degree of Acupuncture & Moxibustion.



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CDUTCM, founded in 1956, is one of the four earliest established institutions of higher learning of TCM approved by the State Council of China. CDUTCM is among the first group of universities eligibleto award master and PhD degrees for Chinese medicine in China. The branch of Acupunctureand Tuina began in 1956 and has become one of the four national key disciplines in CDUTCM.

In the past 10 years, CDUTCM has conducted a total of 135 national, provincial, and ministerial research projects, with fundings over 270 million RMB.

CDUTCM has 6 directly affiliated hospitals,17 non-directly affiliated hospitals,28 teaching hospitals and 36 internship bases. Among of them, Affiliated Hospital of CDUTCM (Sichuan Provincial Chinese Medicine Hospital) is the State Clinical Chinese Medicine Research Base (Diabetes), conferred by National Development and Reform Commission and the State Administration of TCM of China.

This program provides a valuable opportunity for naturopathic doctors, chiropractors doctors, dentist, physiotherapist, or any other regulated medical professionals and practitioners to incorporate acupuncture techniques into their existing practice and offer patients a wider range of natural healing options with more holistic care.

2. Goals and objectives

To facilitate the growing demand of using natural and holistic therapies to promote the body's innate healing and wellness.

To provide the natural healing knowledge and practical skills of TCM/acupuncture (prevention, treatment, patient education, etc.) needed to incorporate into the existing practice.

3. Participants

- The program will begin in the Fall 2024 Semester (10-12 months of completion time).

5. Curriculum synopsis



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This acupuncture program typically consists of a combination of virtual courses and onsite clinical training. The virtual courses include TCM foundation and diagnosis, meridians and acupoints, acupuncture techniques, therapeutics, and TCM/acupuncture classics, etc. The onsite clinical training involves clinical practice for acupuncture techniques and therapies corresponding to their indications.

6. Certificate

Participants who complete the Acupuncture Certification for Medical Professionals program will receive a "Medical Acupuncture Certificate". The certificate will be issued by CITCM/CBC-CDUTCM.

7. Program fees

CAD \$9,980 for both classes and clinical internship.

Books, travelling and accommodation costs (for out of province), or travelling/accommodation for internship in CDUTCM, China (optional), are not included in the program fee.
